1. The expiry date for advertisement, sale, supply, storage and use is extended to **31 JANUARY 2018**.

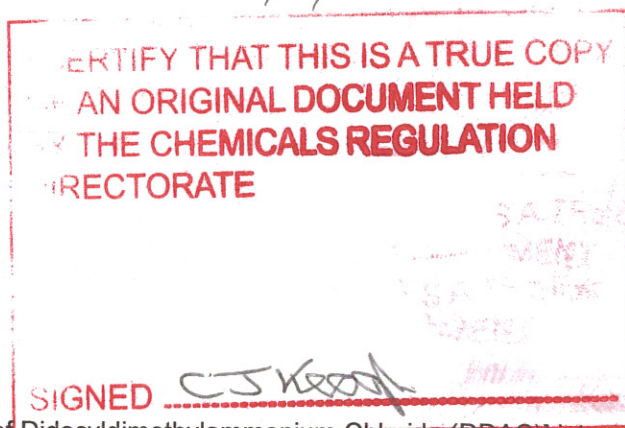

### Explanatory Notes:

1. Commission Decision 2013/4/EU set the date for inclusion of Didecyldimethylammonium Chloride (DDAC) into Annex I of the Biocidal Products Directive (98/8/EC) as 1 February 2015.
2. Article 86 of EU BPR – the EU Biocidal Products Regulations (528/2012) - states that active substances included into Annex I of the Biocidal Products Directive shall be deemed to have been Approved under EU BPR.
3. Article 89 of EU BPR allows Member States to continue applying their existing national rules to biocidal products for up to three years after the date of Approval of the active substance. The UK BPC Regulations – the Biocidal Products and Chemicals (Appointment of Authorities and Enforcement) Regulations 2013 (SI 2013 No 1506) mirror the requirements of Article 89 as regards COPR approvals.
4. Article 89 of EU BPR also requires that application for product authorisation/mutual recognition in parallel was made by the date of Approval, and the outcome of the assessment of such an application may result in an

amendment being made to the COPR Notice of Approval, including the expiry date of the COPR consents being reduced.
